



Aboyne Lodge Primary School: Summary of Catch up Strategy and use of Covid funds.

Funding received 2020-21: £15 920 (provisional)

Number of pupils: 194

Number of vulnerable/disadvantaged pupils: 13

Key priorities:

1. Approaches to learning that champion the need to return to a regular pattern of working but take into account the emotional barriers and potential mental health impacts that home learning and lockdown may have had.
2. Accurate assessment to ensure rapid and sustained catch up that allows all pupils to access the curriculum

Expected outcomes

1. Children to settle into new routines and follow behavioural expectations.
2. By the end of the Autumn term at the latest, children have regained academic confidence to resume learning at the appropriate level. Any children falling short to be targeted for further interventions.
3. Children to be working at least at the standards of pre-Covid by the end of the academic year.
