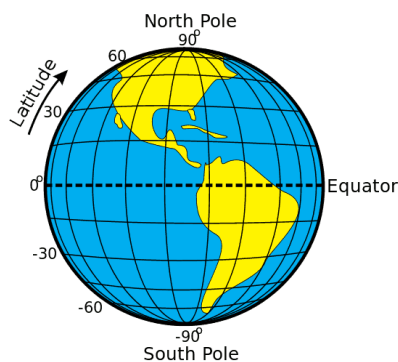
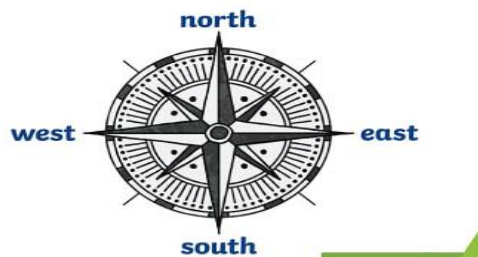
To locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe, South and North America

### Key Vocabulary

Continent	Continuous expanse of land
Ocean	A large body of water
Climate	The weather over a period of time
Equator	An imaginary line around the middle of a planet, half way between the north and south poles
North Pole	The northernmost point on earth
South Pole	The southernmost point on earth
Human Features	Human features like houses, roads and bridges have been built by people
Physical Features	Physical features like seas, mountains and rivers are natural
