This year's fair is themed around bees and other garden critters as it falls on World Bee Day- a day to celebrate pollinators and all the good they do! Your year reps will soon be asking for help to run the various stalls; please volunteer some time if you can. We can't do it without you and it's for a great cause! KS1 in particular need more volunteers!

We are also asking for the following donations; please give whatever you can:

• Food bank items; they are in greatest need of 500ml bottles of cooking oil, small bags of flour and sugar, tins of fruit, noodles and savoury snacks (crisps, crackers). These items will be given to a local food bank as a swap for the alcoholic items

they have been given which they cannot use (which we will use as tombola prizes etc). Please bring donations to the office from now onwards.

- Secondhand soft toys, other toys and games (must be clean, complete and in good working order) please hand in at the office from now until the fair.
- Pocket money toys: new small toys around £1-3 value. These should be handed to the class teacher from now onwards. The class that collects most will get an additional playtime!
- Cakes: ideally 2-3 donations of cakes per year group (must be NUT-FREE). To be brought to school on Friday 19/Sat 20 May. Please let your year rep know if you can donate these.
- A bottle of something for the adults' bottle tombola: alcohol or something non-alcoholic but a bit special. Please bring to school at drop-off on Fri 19th May and hand to an ALSA helper at the front of school. Children can wear non-uniform on this day as a thank you for your donations.

It's already a hive of activity at the school and all the ALSA worker bees are buzz-y getting ready for the fair. It's sure to bee a great day. I'll stop droning on now but, any questions (or bee puns that we've missed!), just give your rep a buzz!

## GIFT AMNESTY Donations- For dads and other loved ones.
