#### MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD

It's been a bracing week weather wise but glorious sunshine, which makes a change for the rain we have had up to now. Rumour has it that the rain is back next week, although it will be a lot milder. Rain jackets are a must as we will aim to get the children outside as much as possible. A quick reminder that the playground equipment is for school time only and I would appreciate it if children stayed off the equipment before and after school. We have had accidents on them when children have been unsupervised in the past.

I have a message from the office team this week. Can all families please make sure that we have up to date contact details for you especially phone numbers. I appreciate that numbers change but it is tricky if we need to get hold of you in an emergency and we have the wrong number.

We are nearly at the stage where we can order the new chairs for the children in the school. Thank you so much for all of the generous donations we have received. It will make a difference to the children's every day experience at school.

Our next aim is to develop the playground. Starting with the area outside the Reception and Year 1 classroom and then moving on to the trim trail and beyond, the playground is in urgent need of some attention. To upgrade the Reception/Year 1 area alone, is coming in at around £55k and the trim trail around another 20—30k. The school does have some capital funds but will need help to make the changes that we would like to make to improve the outdoor experiences of the children. It is a lot of money but with your help, and hopefully the help of some local businesses we can hopefully get there.

You may be aware that the birth rate in St Albans has dropped significantly of late, which means there is less demand for school places. Aboyne is a lovely school with a fantastic community around it—we want to keep the numbers up because ultimately they affect the level of school funding. We are looking to start an Instagram and Twitter account to help celebrate the school in the wider community—more info to follow next week.
