KEF are an NGO working to develop early years teaching in Government schools in their region, developing the curriculum and supporting local teachers. These are schools for children from extremely disadvantaged backgrounds, moving to a play based model rather than a traditional Victorian system of teaching. I was fortunate to go out to India last summer with the [Helga Todd Foundation](#), a charity focused on improving teaching across developing countries, and see some of the
