Year 1 Phonics

90% of the children passed the phonics screening test in Year 1. We don't currently have the National percentage for 2022, which was 83% in 2019

Key Stage 2 SATs

Our SATs scores have been excellent this year, particularly in Maths and SPAG. A small note on Reading. Three of our children missed out by one mark this year, another two by just three marks. Interestingly, the threshold for Reading went up by one mark. However Average Scaled Scores were all above national averages.
