MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD

Dear Parents/Carers,

This week we saw many of our teachers take strike action for the first time in many years. There are further dates to look out for that have been set by the NEU for further walk outs. The teachers taking action set out their reasons in a letter to parents this week, and from my discussions with them, it was a decision that was not taken lightly. I will keep you informed about any potential class closures or changes to events as we get nearer to the second strike date on Weds 1st March.

As a point of information, we now have CCTV cameras around the school. These were installed by the building team during the refurbishment, but have only recently been in operation. They are in place purely for security reasons and overlook areas outside of the building as well as the entrance. They are not in areas that the children regularly inhabit and are not in place to observe pupils. All images are deleted within 30 days. We will put a few signs up around school to make people aware that the cameras are there.

This week we received some new books which were ordered on the back of the travelling book fair. Every class has ordered a number of books to go with the recent purchases of quality books promoting greater representation.

We had two matches this week involving both the girls and boys football teams. The boys played on Tuesday beating St Michaels 7—2 with the girls coming out 5—1 winners against Abbey. Congratulations to both teams who continue to have brilliant seasons so far. We all wish the Boys A team good luck in the Samuel Ryder tournament this evening.

On Tuesday the KS1 children took part in a SETPOINT STEM workshop where they had the opportunity to investigate the properties of materials. It looked like it was great fun and the children learned a lot.
